Who do I contact if I have flooding on my street?

During an emergency, **call 911**.

For a non-emergency, call your city's local police department and/or the Public Works Department. For flooding outside of cities, the sheriff's office emergency communications center can be called.

Solano County Water Agency (SCWA) provides interactive maps, real-time graphs, and dam operations that give information from our monitoring stations. The City of Vacaville has a network of automated creek-level stations for Alamo Creek and Ulatis Creek. The United States Geological Survey has stream gage data. They offer information on gage height, discharge, and velocity. The websites mentioned are listed below.

A flood just happened, can I remove something from the creek on my own?

It is recommended to first double check property lines at the county records, assessors' division. The property owner is responsible for the stream bank on their property. The property owner is also required to notify the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) of any alterations. CDFW will give instructions on how to proceed.

Flood Preparedness and Prevention

How can I prevent flooding? What can I do to be prepared for a flood?

To help prevent flooding, ensure culverts are clear and allow water to flow freely. Regularly clean gutters and remove any accumulated debris. Confirm that flap gates are operational and free of obstructions. For more detailed information on flood awareness, preparation, and prevention, refer to the manual below.
