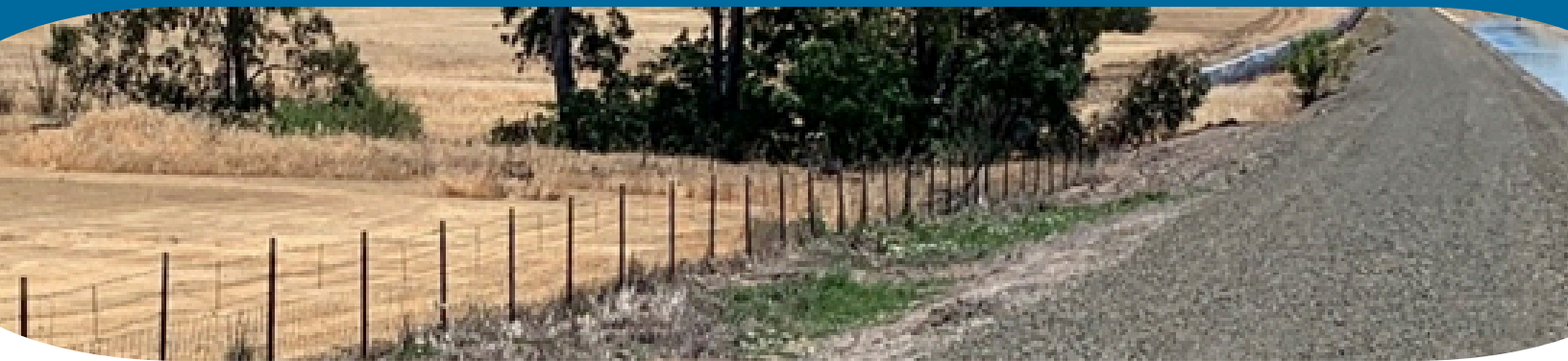


# SECURITY FENCE UPGRADES



## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The purpose of the project is to install new security fencing in areas where there is either no or minimal fencing along Putah South Canal (PSC). This project would protect public health and safety.

## PROJECT BENEFITS

- Install 5-miles of high-quality standard U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) chain-link fencing topped with 3-strand barbed wire.
- 1.5-miles of fencing would be installed within a highly urbanized area of Fairfield. Fencing would help to increase safety of public.
- 3.5-miles of fencing would be installed in a rural residential area, where no fencing currently exists.
- The project would reduce the risk of drownings and liability to USBR and Solano County Water Agency.
- The project would reduce the risk of trespassing and vandalism.
- The project would reduce the risk of drownings of deer and other animals in the PSC.

## JUSTIFICATION

Project will protect against future drownings, trespassing, reduce the risk of vandalism, and reduce the drownings of deer and other animals, which has been a concern to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.



# PROJECT TIMELINE & COSTS

The installation of new security fencing along the Putah South Canal is anticipated to take 2 years and cost \$3M
