1. Approval of the Current Agenda

Patrick Huber moved to approve the amended agenda. Herb Wimmer seconded. The Annual Terrestrial Wildlife Monitoring Project item was removed from the agenda and deferred to the June meeting. The agenda was adopted unanimously.

2. Approval of Minutes of March 12, 2026 Meeting

The March 12, 2026 minutes were reviewed. Members noted several transcription and attendee-list errors, including misspelled names, and omitted attendees. Additional corrections were discussed for attendee names and affiliations. The minutes were approved as amended.

3. Public Comment

Charlie Robinette, a UC Davis graduate student in Community Development, provided an overview of a health impact assessment effort focused on Putah Creek. The project is evaluating potential community health benefits associated with trail, pathway, and creek access improvements. Members discussed the value of incorporating community health considerations into future creek planning efforts.

5. Pattern Calendar

Grant and Project Updates: Stevenson reviewed current grant opportunities and ongoing restoration projects throughout the Putah Creek watershed. Discussion included fish passage improvements, the Stevenson Bridge rehabilitation project, Nishikawa restoration activities, Putah Creek Council planning efforts upstream of Winters, and other habitat enhancement and infrastructure projects. Members discussed project schedules, funding opportunities, and coordination among partner agencies.

6. Data Summit

Stevenson summarized key discussions from the recent Putah Creek Data Summit and highlighted continued collaboration among agencies, researchers, and nonprofit partners.
